### NOTES

- Passengers . Every attempt will be made to accommodate passengers on boats, but this cannot be guaranteed. It may be necessary to take turns.
- Safety. Boats stick together ! Remeber that storms can blow up quickly on Windermere. Owners are requested to bring:  
Fire extinguishers  
Life jackets  
Ground tackle  
Charts of the lake may be purchased from the Lake Warden.
- Fuel . Bring your own coal.  
Paraffin may be purchased locally.
- Licence. SBA members have a special dispensation not to display registration numbers, but the SBA Burgee must be flown at all times.
- Accommodation. For Hotels and guest houses send S.A.E. to Les Gorton for a Tourist Board list.
- Camping. Arrangements have been made for tents and caravans to use the usual field at Lindeth Farm, Lindeth. Please bring your own toilet facilities.
- The Lake District Boat Club. The Club House is open to members every evening except Tuesday, and we look forward to meeting our friends there.
- Other Local Events. Events which may be of interest to members will be mentioned at the briefing at the Wateredge on Saturday evening.

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## WINDERMERE WEEK 1982

As the new organisers of the Windermere week we hope to provide everybody attending with an enjoyable week's steaming. The Lake District Boat Club have once again kindly offered us the use of their Club House which we shall be able to use from Friday 16th until Thursday 22nd. So as not to interfere with their week-end arrangements we will only have the use of their jetties from the Sunday afternoon as in the past. The event is starting earlier this year so that we can participate in the local Maritime England Event, so alternative arrangements will have to be made for mooring on Saturday evening and these will be made known to visiting boat owners.

FRIDAY Launching facilities are available by prior arrangement for those requiring them.

SATURDAY 9 a.m. onwards - Launching at the public slipway. Report on arrival to the Lake Warden. Free facilities are offered by courtesy of the South Lakeland District Council. Trailers may be left behind Storrs Hall Garage for a nominal charge. 4 p.m. Craft taking part to gather in Parsonage Bay (where the public slipway is) and steam in company through Bowness Bay and around Belle Isle. Members are asked to wear Edwardian or similar costume which will add to the occasion. Steam to the Wateredge Hotel, Ambleside hoping to arrive at about 6.45 p.m. A briefing will be held before our evening meal at approx. 7 p.m. to outline details of the week's programme. Dinner at 7.30; (minimum booking required are 30 so please state your requirements on your application form.) This is the final day of the local Maritime England event and on this evening there is to be a Sunset 1000 boat parade through Bowness Bay starting at 9.30 approx. Hopefully we shall be able to join in.

SUNDAY 11 a.m. Steam up. Proceed to Wray Castle for picnic lunch, and walk up to the castle. After lunch, speed trials for those wishing to take part. 4 p.m. Tea stop at the Windermere Steam Boat Museum where we will put our Windermere kettles and whistles to good use. 5 p.m. return to L.D.B.C. 8 p.m. Informal nogg'n 'n natter at L.D.B.C., soup and sandwiches available.

MONDAY 10 a.m. Steam up. Our usual steam down the lake to Fell Foot, the ever popular National Trust centre. There is a Cafeteria, an adventure playground for the youngsters and plenty of space for picnics. Smaller boats may steam down the river to 'The Swan' at Newby Bridge. Tea stop at Rawlinson Nab on the return trip. 8 p.m. Buffet Dinner at the L.D.B.C prepared by the wonderful Mrs Jones and the ladies of the Club. The Windermere Trophy will be presented for the most innovative boat.

TUESDAY 10 a.m. Steam up for our publicity day; Edwardian dress and brass gleaming please. A prize will be awarded for the skipper of the best dressed boat. Steam from the Club House to the Public Pier to pick up passengers. We shall then steam out as far as Rampholme and down the west side of Belle Isle, arriving at the Steam Boat Museum at approximately 11.30 a.m. They will provide a buffet lunch for us, tea and biscuits for a nominal charge of £1 per head. There will also be a film show and games. 5 p.m. return to L.D.B.C. 8 p.m. Informal Barbecue at Lindeth Farm as in previous years. Help will be required from all hands!

WEDNESDAY 9.30 a.m. Coach trip to Lowther Wild Life Park and trip on Ullswater aboard former S.L. LADY OF THE LAKE. Coach will pick us up from Bowness Pier 9.30. We will visit the Wild Life Park at Lowther which should provide entertainment for young and old alike; we will then stop for a pub lunch at the 'Queen's Head' at Askham where they have a model railway in the garden, children welcome. This will be followed by our trip on the LADY OF THE LAKE which was built in 1877. As an alternative the more energetic may like to walk up as far as Aira Force. Return to Windermere. 7.45 Gather at the Royal Windermere Yacht Club for a slide show kindly given by Mr. C. T. Tyson. Members may like to bring their own slides and films along to be shown also; if you intend to do this please inform me in advance so that the right equipment may be ordered. Food and bar snacks will be available at reasonable prices if ordered before 7 p.m. An indication of numbers will be asked for at the briefing. There is adequate car parking and pier space here.

THURSDAY 10 a.m. Steam up to Ambleside, keeping to the West shore. Stop in Pull Wyke Bay for coffee. This will enable the slower craft e.g. WINANDER to catch up. Everyone must have heard of our Wateredge Hotel lunches and this will again take place, or picnics can be eaten in the garden. Leave Wateredge and steam back to Bowness, keeping to the East shore. Haul out in the late afternoon. Nogg'n and natter for any members staying on after the event. Soup and sandwiches available at the L.D.B.C. if numbers are known in advance.
